GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OLD COURT HOUSE – 7 MAIN STREET, BATAVIA, NY WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2025

The Genesee County Legislature met in regular session on Wednesday, February 12, 2025 at 5:30 PM in the Legislative Chambers of the Old Courthouse.

Legislator Torrey offered to assist with the audit and Legislator Hawley offered the prayer and the Pledge to the Flag.

Roll Call was taken to establish a quorum with 9 in attendance: Legislators Clattenburg, Klotzbach, Dibble, Hawley, Torrey, Maha, Stein, Yunker and Deleo.

Approval of Minutes: Chair Stein approved the January 29, 2025 meeting minutes.

<u>Committee & Special Assignment Reports</u>: Chair Stein thanked Legislator Dibble for volunteering to serve on the steering committee as the second legislative member.

<u>County Manager Report</u>: County Manager Matt Landers reported that two sales tax payments are in, both up, only 1/12 of the way through and up 8%. He also received an update by Laura Wadhams regarding salt, they are keeping up barely, utilizing inventory by using less salt in areas with less traffic and back roads, but they are still able to salt effectively. He is hoping the shipment comes soon as some of the towns need the salt more. This is something to monitor, but not critical yet. He will be reaching out to Laura to stay updated. Mr. Landers also stated he is excited to have Jessica Riley here, who is our newest Department Head for Office of the Aging, appointment to be approved tonight.

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, in 2016 Genesee County did contract with Lawley Genesee for Broker/Risk Management Services to review and evaluate the County's risks and appropriateness of various coverages, and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney does recommend that this contract with Lawley Genesee be continued, and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Ways and Means reviewed this recommendation and does concur at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairperson of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized to renew a contract with Lawley Genesee, 20 Jefferson Square, Batavia, NY 14020, for the provision of Broker/Risk Management Services in the amount of \$27,000 for the period of February 1, 2025 (retroactively) through January 31, 2026.

Budget Impact: The cost of \$27,000 is included in the 2025 budget.

Legislator Yunker seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 200 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 54 INSURANCE RENEWAL – COUNTY ATTORNEY/

2025-2026 POLICY WITH NYMIR – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the County Attorney's office prepared and submitted the 2025/26 Insurance Renewal Application to the Lawley Agency and

WHEREAS, Lawley has presented a 2025-2026 renewal proposal with the County's current insurance carrier, New York Municipal Insurance Reciprocal (NYMIR) to the County for the same level of coverage, and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney's Office has recommended that the County renew coverage with NYMIR, and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby designate New York Municipal Insurance Reciprocal, 12 Metro Park Road, Suite 208, Colonie, NY 12205-1139 to provide for the period February 1, 2025 (retroactively) through January 31, 2026 insurance coverage of \$1/\$2 million General Liability, \$1/\$2 million Owners/Contractors Protective Liability, Inland Marine, Commercial Auto Liability, Law Enforcement Liability and Public Officials Liability with a \$1 million self-insured retention by Genesee County and \$1/\$3 million Health Care Professional Liability and \$1/\$2 million Health Care General Liability for the Health Department, Mental Health Department, and County Jail, and Excess Catastrophe Liability.

Budget Impact: Anticipated annual premium of \$460,315 based on current inventory levels. Fluctuations may occur based on vehicle and equipment inventory. Funds were appropriated in the 2025 Budget to cover the expense.

Legislator Yunker seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 200 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 55

REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZING LEGISLATION – MORTGAGE TAX INCREASE EXTENSION APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the County of Genesee has imposed an additional one-quarter of one percent (0.25%) local tax on mortgages for real property situated within the County of Genesee in addition to the tax imposed on said mortgages with the local tax of one-quarter of one percent to be used for the purpose of offsetting expenses of the Recording/County Clerk's Office or any County General Fund purpose in Genesee County, and

WHEREAS, the legislation authorizing such additional mortgage tax will expire October 31, 2025 and the County Legislature wishes to extend its provisions to October 31, 2027. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Genesee County Legislature does hereby petition State Senator George Borrello and Assemblyman Stephen M. Hawley to draft and introduce such legislation and further requests the New York State Legislature to support the legislation necessary to continue a one-quarter of one percent (0.25%) increase in Genesee County's mortgage tax rate through October 31, 2027. Be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senator George Borrello and Assemblymen Stephen M. Hawley and any other agency as indicated by the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature.

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby request New York State Senator George Borrello and Assemblyman Stephen Hawley to draft and introduce Legislation authorizing Genesee County to renew the additional 1% Sales Tax provision to November 30, 2027, and Be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Kathy Hochul,

Senator George Borrello, Assemblyman Stephen Hawley, New York State Association of Counties and Genesee Association of Municipalities.

CHANGE ORDER –DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS/PHASE 2 WATER SUPPLY/CPL CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, CPL has requested final payment on outstanding items relating to the Phase 2 Water Supply Construction Administration contract, and

WHEREAS, Genesee County and CPL have agreed to a reduced Phase 2 construction administration and inspection final payment in the amount of \$131,509.90, and

WHEREAS, this payment includes additional construction administration activities associated with the Mumford and Churchville Pump Station Impeller Corrosion, Existing Pump Station Upgrades, and the Golden Road Pump Station Startup, including overall inspection overages, additional coordination with suppliers, shutdown schedule reviews, and temporary bypass pumps, and

WHEREAS, the County Commissioner of Public Works has reviewed this change order for need and accuracy of pricing, and

WHEREAS, the Committee of Ways and Means did review this recommendation and does concur. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature does hereby authorize this change order in the amount of \$131,509.90 for CPL, 255 Woodcliff Drive, Suite 200, Fairport, NY 14450 to account for final Phase 2 construction administration and inspection costs.

Budget Impact: The total amount for the change order is \$131,509.90. The change to CPL's contract brings the total contract amount to \$1,281,509.90. This contract is paid through the County Water Fund and there are sufficient funds budgeted to cover this additional expense.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract with the following provider, for the provision of Special Education Itinerant Teacher (SEIT) Services, Classroom Services (CB), and Evaluator Services in the Preschool Supportive Health Services Program (PSSHSP), retroactively, for the period of December 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025, per the 2024-2025 PSSHSP rate schedule for Hearing and Speech of Western New York - 2980 William Street, Cheektowaga, NY 14227.

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways & Means did review this award and do recommend approval at this time, Now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement with The Lamar Companies, P.O. Box 10756 Rochester NY 14610, to provide outdoor billboard advertising to promote lead testing for children, not to exceed \$21,960.

Budget Impact: Expenses associated with this agreement are not to exceed \$21,960. All expenses are included in the 2025 4010 budget and will be reimbursed by the Lead CDC grant. The cost to the county is \$0.

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways & Means did review the request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Purchasing Director is hereby authorized to dispose of the (1) gray metal desk, (1) long wooden table, assorted binders, (4) filing Cabinets, (2) tv's, (2) tv carts, (1) beige desk, (1) tabletop desk, (1) brown tabletop desk, numerous hanging shelves, (5) office chairs, (7) index card cabinets and (1) whiteboard, by the method deemed most appropriate by that department.

WORKER RETENTION PAYMENT–PUBLIC HEALTH/PUBLIC HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE, WORKFORCE & DATA SYSTEMS GRANT-APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 67

WHEREAS, the Public Health Department accepted funding (2023 resolution #289) from the Center for Disease Control & Prevention with the purpose of the PH Infrastructure, Workforce & Data Systems Grant to address long-standing weaknesses due to chronic underinvestment in New York's public health system and strengthen preparedness to address new challenges and better meet the ongoing and future public health needs of New Yorkers, and

WHEREAS, the Public Health Department continues to experience high rates of turnover and vacancies due to employees leaving for alternative employment, and

WHEREAS, to entice employees to remain in their employment with the County, the Public Health Department recommends using funds from the PH Infrastructure, Workforce & Data Systems grant to provide a worker retention payment in the amount of \$3,000 for Genesee County Public Health hourly employees and \$4,000 for Genesee County Public Health Management employees with the total amount of \$3,000 for hourly employees and \$4,000 for Management

employees to be paid in two (2) equal payments, the first payment being on May 16, 2025 and the second payment on November 14, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways & Means are in agreement and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer and Human Resources Director are hereby authorized and directed to provide worker retention payments to eligible Public Health Department employees using the following criteria; hourly employees who work 30 hours or more per week shall receive a retention payment of \$3,000 and management employees who work 30 hours or more per week shall receive a retention payment of \$4,000, and be it further

RESOLVED, that to be eligible for the retention payments, an employee shall be employed as of April 30, 2025 for the payment on May 16, 2025 and an employee shall be employed as of October 31, 2025 for the payment on November 14, 2025. Be it further

RESOLVED, that the total amount of \$3,000 for hourly staff and \$4,000 for management staff will be paid in two (2) equal payments, the first on May 16, 2025 and the second payment on November 14, 2025.

Budget Impact: All expenses for the retention payments are included in the 2025 A.4010 budget and are offset by the PH Infrastructure, Workforce & Data Systems Grant funds, with no cost to the county. The total estimated amount of retention payments with fringe is \$117,464.

Legislator Yunker seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 200 votes.
