

Present: Committee Legislators Torrey, Deleo, Hawley and Borrelli. Legislators Dibble and Clattenburg attended. County Attorney Mark Boylan, Clerk of the Legislature Lisa Casey, County Manager Matt Landers, Deputy County Manager Tammi Ferringer, Veterans Services Director William Joyce, Mental Health Services Deputy Director Peter Mittiga, Historian & Records Management Officer Michael Eula, Public Health Director Paul Pettit, Business Education Alliance Director Karyn Winters attended.

The meeting was opened on March 30, 2026 at 4:30 p.m. Meeting location was at 7 Main Street, Old Court House in Batavia, New York. In the Legislative Conference Room.

Committee Chair Torrey announced a quorum was established.

Minutes of the March 2, 2026 Human Services Committee meeting were approved as presented by Committee Chair Torrey.

Veterans Services Director William Joyce recommended accepting the donation of 2,450 concert series tickets from Batavia Downs Gaming and Hotel to be redistributed to local Veterans. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Borrelli seconded by Legislator Deleo, carried unanimously.

Historian & Records Management Officer Michael Eula recommended executing the contractual acceptance between the Genesee County and the following parties: American Legion Batavia Post office; Batavia Players, Inc.; Steven Edenbo; Derek Maxfield; Oatka Festival Inc.; and Curt Radabaugh; for a period beginning on February 12th, 2026, and ending on November 14th, 2026. Genesee County funding award of \$15,000 from New York State 250th Commemoration Commission allows the support of activities for commemorating the American Revolution and the work of New Yorkers over the 250 years. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Deleo seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Mental Health Services Deputy Director Peter Mittiga requested authorization to amend the 2026 budget to take the administrative fee of \$8,415.00 from Other Liabilities and put it into Opioid Settlement and to amend the 2026 budget by increasing appropriation Personnel training in the amount of \$56,100.00 and increasing revenue Opioid Settlement in a like amount with monies coming from Other Liabilities. Mental Health Services Deputy Director Mittiga recommended executing the MOU for Opioid Abatement Settlement Funds following the specifications of the RFA received for the term ending 12/31/2026: YWCA of Genesee County, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$56,100.00. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Deleo seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Public Health Director Paul Pettit recommended executing an agreement with the New York State Department of Health, for the acceptance of the Radon Program contract, to accept funding in the amount of \$10,000 and to execute any and all other documentation related to this funding, for the period July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Deleo seconded by Legislator Borrelli, carried unanimously.

Public Health Director Paul Pettit recommended executing an agreement with Viken Detection, in order to purchase a certified XRF machine and resourcing service not to exceed the amount of

\$19,990. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Borrelli seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Public Health Director Paul Pettit recommended executing an agreement with The Audacy Company, in order to provide radio and social media advertising to promote lead testing for children at a cost not to exceed \$18,304, for the period of June 1, 2026 through September 30, 2026. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Borrelli seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Public Health Director Paul Pettit recommended executing an agreement with The Albion Strawberry Festival, in order to purchase booth space at the 2026 Albion Strawberry Festival on June 12th and 13th for \$100. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Borrelli seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Public Health Director Paul Pettit recommended executing an agreement with The Genesee County Agricultural Society, in order to purchase booth space (\$0 cost) at the 2026 Genesee County Fair. This was referred to the Ways and Means Agenda upon motion of Legislator Deleo seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Business Education Alliance Director Karyn Winters presented an annual report discussing BEA Funding Efforts, Changes to Programming and Anticipated Increase in Services: BEA Summer Career Exploration Camps give middle school students hands-on opportunities to explore careers in fields such as automotive technology, culinary arts, skilled trades, computer science, engineering, and medicine. The BEA delivers financial literacy, work readiness, and entrepreneurship programs through Junior Achievement (JA) in schools across Genesee County, The BEA continues to partner with local IDAs and the GLOW Workforce Development Board to expand and sustain hands-on career exploration events in the GLOW Region, New York State's proposed *Portrait of a Graduate* shifts graduation requirements away from Regents Exams toward a competency-based model where students demonstrate learning through real-world, meaningful experiences. Business Education Alliance Director Karyn Winters also reviewed the 2026 BEA summer career exploration camps, Annual Breakfast, Sporting Clays Shoot fundraiser and tool drive.

County Manager Matt Landers recommended executing an agreement by and between the County of Genesee and the Genesee County Chamber of Commerce, for the Business Education Alliance program during the contract term of January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 in the amount of \$3,107.00. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Borrelli seconded by Legislator Hawley, carried unanimously.

Clerk of the Legislature Lisa Casey announced the next Human Services Committee Meeting will be on Monday, May 4, 2026 at 4:30 p.m. Committee Chair Torrey adjourned the Human Services meeting at 4:57 p.m.
