WEDNESDAY, APRIL 22, 2026**

The Genesee County Legislature met in regular session on Wednesday, April 22, 2026 at 5:30 PM in the Legislative Chambers of the Old Courthouse.

Legislator Clattenburg offered to assist with the audit. Legislator Hawley offered to assist with the Prayer and the Pledge to the Flag.

Roll Call was taken to establish a quorum with 8 in attendance: Legislators Yunker, Dibble, Hawley, Torrey, Deleo, Clattenburg, Mancuso and Borrelli (Klotzbach absent).

Proclamations & Commendations:

Crime Victims' Rights Week presented by Legislator Dibble and accepting Sheriff Joseph Graff, Nicole Easton, Genesee Justice Program Coordinator and Jada Gerber, Community/Victim Services Counselor.

National Correctional Officer Week presented by Legislator Deleo and accepting Sheriff Joseph Graff, CO. Jerod Swimline and CO Maria Blawowitz.

Approval Of Minutes: April 8, 2026 Legislature Minutes approved by Chairman Yunker as presented.

Committee & Special Assignment Reports: Legislator Torrey reported last Monday he attended the GCC Board of Trustee Meeting and stated there were a couple events coming up; on May 2 is the 45<sup>th</sup> annual Fashion Show, on May 4 is the joint meeting with GCC Trustees and Legislature and on May 16 is the 50<sup>th</sup> Commencement ceremony. Chairman Yunker gave a special shoutout to Legislator Borrelli for the Youth Board Awards last night, great event and very proud of the youth in this community and all that they are doing. Chairman Yunker mentioned attending the Water Resources Agency meeting stating Phase II project coming to an end, last items to finish are the pump stations that are on the East side of the County or West side of Monroe County with most of them wrapping up this summer. Chair Yunker spoke of Phase III Water Project stating it still has a lot of work ahead with Arcadis and staff, the master plan and basic design is about 80% complete with hopes to have it complete by mid-June. In general, Chair Yunker has met with county Manager to dial in on 5-10-and 25-year projects and looking for which projects would be priority and cost-efficient. Legislator Clattenburg mentioned that the aquafer status looks good, better than it has been in the past. Chairman Yunker commented it looks to be at a five-year high, best shape the aquafer has been in the past five years.

Communications & Petitions: Mr. Jerod Baltz, from the Town of Pavilion, signed up to speak about the Travel Out of State Request. Legislature heard his comments on reporting to Sheriff's Office about cyber criminality and social media problems.

Travel Out of State Request: G. Patnode, B. Schollard, D. Weatherell, C. Dodson and M. Heale, OEM to Baltimore, MD for 2026 Internation HazMat Conference from June 16-20, 2026. Fully Grant Funded. (\$19,695). Legislator Clattenburg motioned to approve the Out of State request seconded by Legislator Deleo, carried unanimously.

Legislator Comments: Legislator Hawley reported going on a ride-a-long with Office for the Aging this past week by meeting with Colleen Hyde and then with the volunteer driver who was Matt Buckley. All the people who deliver food are volunteers, Legislator Hawley stated they went to nine different places and each client was very appreciative. Legislator Mancuso also commented on the ride-a-long and went to eleven homes, they know their clients well and she was really impressed.

County Manager Report: County Manager Landers spoke in regards to the YMCA old facility. They will be conducting a split between the Office for the Aging and YMCA which will happen the week of April 27<sup>th</sup> as OFA and the old YMCA are fused together. Once separated appropriately they will take the old YMCA down. Pre-planning with OFA staff about possible shifting some offices due to noise, and if necessary, moving over to the old Genesee Justice in front of the jail. The cost for the split are still to be determined, Manger Landers stated the County has not committed to any amounts.

**CONTRACT RENEWAL-INFORMATION  
TECHNOLOGY/36-MONTH INTERNET & PHONE  
SERVICE-APPROVAL OF**

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, the Director of Information Technology did present a 36-month agreement with Empire Access to provide internet and phone services to various County buildings, and

**WHEREAS**, the Committee of Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval. Now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the agreement with Empire Access, 34 Main Street, Prattsburgh, NY 14873 for a 36-month Internet and phone services agreement effective March 6, 2026 through March 5, 2029 at a cost of \$3,769.70 a month for 9 fiber lines of service and 2 phone lines.

Budget Impact: \$3,769.70 monthly charge from A.1680 4290.0400 NY Phone-Basic Svc and A.1680 4290.0600 Internet/T1/Bridge/Band. There is no change in cost.

**RESOLVED**, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby declare these three-ring binders as surplus and, be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Purchasing Director is hereby authorized to dispose of the nineteen (19) three-ring binders by the method deemed most appropriate by that department.

Budget Impact: Proceeds from any items sold at auction would go to the County’s General Fund.

**CONTRACT AMENDMENT–THIRD PARTY ADMINISTRATION OF SELF-FUNDED PHARMACY BENEFIT PLAN–APPROVAL OF**

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, resolution No. 332 awarded a contract to provide Third-Party Administration for the Genesee County’s Self-Funded Pharmacy Benefit Plan to Keenan Pharmacy Purchasing Coalition (KPPC), and

**WHEREAS**, Keenan Pharmacy Purchasing Coalition partners with Express Scripts Inc., to provide a plan with leverage for large group pricing discounts and rebates, and

**WHEREAS**, Keenan Pharmacy Purchasing Coalition evaluates the County’s claim utilization and negotiates pricing with Express Scripts Inc. annually and pricing improvements are then passed through to the County based on these annual negotiations, and

**WHEREAS**, the Committee on Ways and Means did review this recommendation and does concur. Now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to amend the Pharmacy Benefit Management agreement with Express Scripts Inc., 1 Express Way, St. Louis, MO 63121, for the provision of prescription drug benefit management services. The amendment is effective as of January 1, 2025.

Budget Impact: Approximate saving of 6.54% or \$125,776 for the administration of the Self-Funded Pharmacy Benefit.

Legislator Borrelli seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 200 votes.

**WHEREAS**, the County issued RFP 2023-118 for the provision of Housing Support and Consulting Services, and

**WHEREAS**, the Deputy County Manager and the Genesee Region Housing Initiatives Committee (HIC) recommend renewing the contract for the first of three optional one-year term renewals under the same terms and conditions as the original agreement, and

**WHEREAS**, the Human Services and Ways and Means Committees have reviewed this recommendation and does concur. Now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute a renewal agreement with PathStone Corporation, 400 East Avenue, Rochester, New York for the provision of Housing Support and Consultant Services for the period January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026, in the amount of \$12,150.

Budget Impact: Anticipated expenses in the amount of \$12,150 have been included in the 2025 A.8989 Home & Community budget.

**WHEREAS**, resolution No. 489 adopted December 13, 2017, did authorize the renewal agreement between Genesee County and the City of Batavia for joint occupancy of the Genesee County Courts Facility for the first of six 10-year renewal periods, and

**WHEREAS**, notification has been made by the City of Batavia to extend the agreement for the second ten year period, which would continue the agreement through June 24, 2036, under the same terms and conditions as the original Agreement, and

**WHEREAS**, the Committee on Ways and Means has reviewed this request and does concur. Now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the renewal with the City of Batavia, a municipal corporation of the State of New York with offices at One Batavia City Centre, Batavia, New York 14020 for the joint occupancy of the Genesee County Courts Facility for the period of June 25, 2026 through June 24, 2036.

Budget Impact: Pursuant to Section 3.03, the City is responsible for their proportionate share of the operation and maintenance costs of the Courts Facility on an annual basis.

**WHEREAS**, the County Historian is recommending acceptance of the six (6) vendor contracts for a ten (10) month period, beginning on February 12<sup>th</sup>, and ending on November 14<sup>th</sup>, reflecting events that are part of a state-wide commemoration of America's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary as an independent nation, and

**WHEREAS**, as the six (6) contracts attached to this resolution provide for a variety of events appropriate to said commemoration, and

**WHEREAS**, Genesee County's funding award of \$15,000 from New York State 250<sup>th</sup> Commemoration Commission allows the support of activities to commemorating the American Revolution and the work of New Yorkers over the 250 years, and

**WHEREAS**, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

The attached contracts represent \$14,600 of said Commission grant to Genesee County. The balance of \$400 will be reflected in two additional events yet to be contracted for although verbally agreed upon. This brings the total to \$15,000. An additional event is of no cost to the county.

**WHEREAS**, the Director of Community Services within the Mental Health department is bringing forward the 2025 RFA for OASAS Opioid allocated LGU funding. YWCA of Genesee County, Inc. has been approved for a total of \$56,100.00 for Treatment (\$10,000.00), Investments Across Service Continuum (\$10,000.00), Housing (\$15,000.00), Priority Populations (\$5,000.00), Prevention (\$5,000.00), Transportation (\$1,100), Public Awareness (\$10,000.00) and administrative fees (\$8,415.00). The identified funds were received in 2025 and will be distributed in 2026 to YWCA of Genesee County, Inc. for identified purposed outlined above, and

**WHEREAS**, the Director of the Community Mental Health Services and the Community Services Board does approve this request and would like to allocate YWCA of Genesee County, Inc. the amount of \$56,100.00, and

**WHEREAS**, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2026 budget to take the administrative fee of \$8,415.00 from the A.688.2 Other Liabilities and put it into A.4314.2735 Opioid Settlement, and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2026 budget by increasing appropriation A.4314.4550.0000 Personnel training in the amount of \$56,100.00 and increasing revenue A.4314.2735 Opioid Settlement in a like amount with monies coming from A.688.2 Other Liabilities, and be it further

**RESOLVED**, the Chairperson of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the MOU for Opioid Abatement Settlement Funds following the specifications of the RFA received for the term ending 12/31/2026: YWCA of Genesee County, Inc., 301 North St., Batavia, NY 14020 in an amount not to exceed \$56,100.00.

Budget Impact: There is no County cost, NYS OASAS funding will cover total amount of \$56,100.00, and the county will keep the 15% administrative fee of \$8,415.00.

**WHEREAS**, the Public Health Director has requested that Genesee County accept this funding which stipulates that this revenue will be used to support local radon activities, and

**WHEREAS**, the Committees on Human Services and Ways & Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement with the New York State Department of Health, having its principal location of business at, Corning Tower, Room 2748 Empire State Plaza, Albany, NY 12237, for the acceptance of the Radon Program contract, to accept funding in the amount of \$10,000 and to execute any and all other documentation related to this funding, for the period July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

Budget Impact: Revenue and expenses, in the amount of \$10,000 have been appropriated in the 2025 & 2026 Dept. 4010 – Public Health Department program budgets. \$0 cost to the county, revenue and expenses offset.

Budget Impact: Expenses included in this agreement not to exceed \$19,990 will be reimbursed by the HUD Lead Grant and are included in the 2026 4010 budget. The cost to the county is \$0.
