ELEVENTH DAY GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE Batavia, New York Wednesday, June 9, 2021

The Genesee County Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, June 9, 2021 at 5:30 PM in the Legislative Chambers of the Old Courthouse and remotely using ZOOM. Legislator Yunker assisted with the audit. The prayer was offered by Legislator Maha followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

In addition to our regular meeting Legislature Chair Stein opened a Public Hearing on the Genesee Community College proposed operating budget for the academic year 2021-2022 and County sponsor share. All interested parties were invited to be heard.

Legislator Yunker read a proclamation for Dairy Month and invited Farm Bureau Representative Natasha Sutherland and Dairy Princess Amelia Brewer and her court of Dairy Ambassadors Maggie Winspear, Jillian Brewer and Dairy Maid Claire Lamb to share comments regarding the importance of dairy and the impact in Genesee County.

Minutes of the May 26, 2021 Legislature meeting were approved upon motion of Legislator Clattenburg seconded by Legislator Maha, carried unanimously.

Legislature Chair Stein commented on recent discussions pertaining to the State legislation that allows cities, towns and villages to opt out of allowing cannabis retail stores. If a municipality opts out before December 31st they may opt back in in the future. She also stated she attended the Finger Lakes Regional Economic Development Council meeting and they reviewed the draft report which is due on June 23, the final report is due to the Governor June 30. She indicated there will be two different funding announcement times; August 30 and late in the fall.

Assistant County Manager Tammi Ferringer shared information from the Governor's office regarding the lifting of pandemic restrictions. The announcement stated that when 70 % of the population 18 and older has received at least one vaccination most restrictions will be lifted. That milestone is expected to be reached later next week.

Budget Impact: PERS funding is 75%-90% covered through Title III-E Caregiver Support Program, Unmet Needs, and Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly (EISEP) with a required county 10-25% match. PERS cost for 2021 was incorporated into the adopted county budget for up to \$12,240. As grant funds increase the ability to spend more for program participants to provide PERS will increase and will be reflected in the annual county budget.
