The meeting was opened on June 18, 2025 at 4:30 p.m. Meeting location was at 7 Main Street in Batavia, New York at the Old Courthouse in the Legislative Conference room.

Committee Chair Clattenburg announced a quorum was established.

Committee Chair Clattenburg amended the agenda to add a resolution Contract-Treasurer/In-Rem Tax Foreclosure Proceedings/Phillips Lytle LLP under County Treasurer Kevin Andrews. County Treasurer Kevin Andrews recommended entering into a contract with Phillips Lytle LLP, for in rem tax foreclosure proceeding legal services for the 2023 tax year at a cost of \$475 per parcel as well as reimbursement of incurred mailing, publication, recording, and posting costs as outlined in the contract. Legislator Stein motioned to amend the resolution to add the attorney review seconded by Maha, carried unanimously. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Stein seconded by Legislator Torrey, carried unanimously.

Job Development Bureau Director Teresa VanSon requested authorization to make the following budget item transfer: \$11,250.00 from Pers Svc-Work Experience, \$2,250.00 to Supplies – Part and \$9,000.00 to Tuitions-Part. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Stein seconded by Legislator Torrey, carried unanimously.

Compliance Officer Pam LaGrou presented an annual report which discussed ARPA projects such as: Alexander water, Batavia water, Broadband, Cybersecurity, Chamber of Commerce, Go ART!, and Employee retention. She briefly covered the corporate compliance annual training requirements, discussed creating a HIPAA Training on NeoGov, and reviewed plans for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program 49 CFR Part 26, Title VI, the Corporate Compliance Plan and Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP). She also reviewed over forty unique federal, state and private grant opportunities, briefly reviewed the new policies adopted and the existing policies that have been reviewed by the Policy and Procedure committee.

County Manager Matt Landers presented a travel out of state request for Michael Burns, in IT to travel to San Diego, CA, for a cost of \$2,930. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Torrey seconded by Legislator Maha, carried unanimously.
