Environmental Science Summer Camp at Genesee County Park

Summer is all about camp at the Genesee County Parks! We had a blast hosting two annual day camps this summer— Environmental Science Summer Camp and Camp Hard Hat. Both camps engage students in hands-on activities throughout the park that aim to inspire them to explore careers in the environmental science and skilled trades fields.

Environmental Science Summer Camp is for students entering 7th—10th grade and includes 5 days of hands-on activities and field trips. Our schedule was jam packed! We did a stream study with scientists from the Genesee County Soil & Water Conservation District, learned survival skills with NYS Parks, had some friendly competition with an Olympics-themed day, took a field trip to Letchworth State Park, learned about wilderness first aid, and met a Environmental Conservation Officer and their K-9 partner!

Camp Hard Hat celebrated its ten year anniversary this year in the place where it all began, Genesee County Park & Forest.

Karyn Winters of the Business Education Alliance (BEA) and Rich Monroe and Kelly Mileham of the GV BOCES Building Trades program assembled 30 campers ages 12 to 15 for the 10th annual Camp Hard Hat at Genesee County Park.

This week-long day camp provides students with an opportunity to learn about the skilled trades and then put that knowledge into action. Each year they build something and unveil it at the end of camp. These are no small feats—Camp Hard Hat campers have built everything from picnic tables and bird nest boxes to bridges and pavilions! You'll notice dedication signs hung on each of their projects throughout the park.

Through Camp Hard Hat, they are introduced to careers and opportunities that they may not have been aware of, opening the door to possibilities as they think about their futures!

Join the Run for the ACORNS on Sunday, October 6th!

Come join us at the Genesee County Park & Forest Sunday on October 6, 2024. If you can't make it that day there will be a virtual option to run the 5K or 10K course at the park between 7AM Friday October 4 and 5PM Saturday October 5, 2024 using the mobile RaceJoy tracking app.

Walk or run on single and double track trails through the forest, along a creek and up and down rolling hills in the Genesee County Park & Forest, with an estimated 100 feet of climb in the 10K loop. Trails are very wide and easy to negotiate (minimal rocks and roots). The course starts on asphalt and then leads into the woods for a truly beautiful run through the countryside.


Create a Critter
