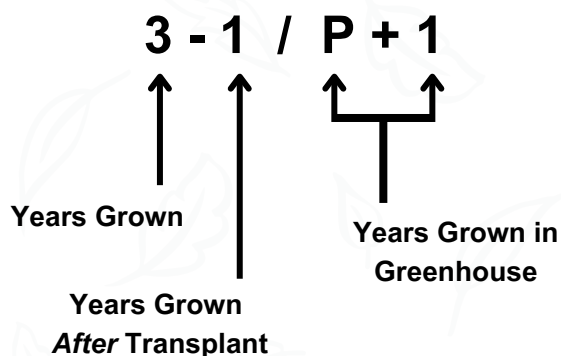


Genesee County Soil & Water Conservation Welcomes You to Our 2025 Tree & Shrub Seedling Catalog!

BARE ROOT CONIFER SEEDLINGS

FIR, DOUGLAS (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*)

Grows 100-120' in height but is known to exceed 200ft. Prefers full sun and moist, well-drained loamy soils. Will not do well on flat, wet, heavy clay soils. Soft flat needles are easily identifiable.

Size: 3-0, 9-15"



FIR, CONCOLOR (*Abies concolor*)

Grows 80-130' in height. Prefers partial sun and well drained soils but is tolerant to a variety of conditions (excluding wet soils). Needles are long with blue-green color that have a pleasant citrus/orange scent.

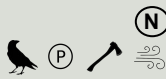
Size: 2-0/3-0, 12-18"



PINE, RED (*Pinus resinosa*) **NEW!**

Grows rapidly to 70-80' in height. Prefers well-drained soils and full sun. Shade intolerant. Needles grow in bundles of two and break cleanly when bent. Bark forms reddish gray/orange scaly plates. Irregular spreading branches, often bare on lower half once mature.

Size: 2-0/3-0, 5-10"



PINE, SCOTCH (*Pinus sylvestris*)

Grows 50-75' tall; fast growing. Prefers full to partial sun and a variety of soil types. Needles are in bundles of two and are blue green in color. Bark is peeling and has a brownish-orange color.

Size: 2-0, 10-16"



LARCH, EUROPEAN **NEW!** (*Larix laricina*)

Grows 60-100' in height. Prefers moist soils and full sun to partial shade. Long soft needles that are light green in color and turn yellow in the fall.

Size: 1-0, 6-12"



SPRUCE, WHITE

(*Picea glauca*)
Grows 30 - 100' tall, slower growing, NY native. Prefers moist well-drained soils and is shade tolerant. Does not tolerate dry soils. Has a higher demand for soil fertility than other common conifers. Used for reforestation. Takes 8 - 12 years for Christmas trees.

BARE ROOT CONIFER TRANSPLANTS OR SEEDLINGS

FIR, FRASER (*Abies fraseri*)

Grows 40 - 70' tall, moderate growth rate. Requires cool, moist, well drained soils. Won't do well on flat, wet, heavy, clay soils, and tolerates some shade. Takes 8 - 12 years for Christmas trees.

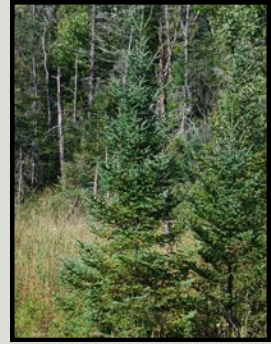
Size: T: 3-1/P+1, 8-14"



FIR, BALSAM (*Abies balsamea*)

Grows 20 - 60' tall, NY native, cold climate tree. Slow growing. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Seedlings require full to partial sun but need less light as they mature. Most common Christmas Tree.

Size: T: 2-1/P+1, 8-14"



SPRUCE, COLORADO BLUE (*Picea pungens*)

Grows 50-100' in height, slow growing. Easy to grow in variety of soils and grows in partial to full sun. Very popular tree for its beauty with showy silvery-blue or green color.

Size: S: 3-0, 9-15"

T: 2-1/P+1, 8-14"



SPRUCE, NORWAY (*Picea abies*)

Grows 50-75' tall; fast growing. Prefers full to partial sun and a variety of soil types. Needles are in bundles of two and are blue green in color. Bark is peeling and has a brownish-orange color.

Size: S: 3-0, 10-15"

T: 2-1, 10-16"



PINE, EASTERN WHITE (*Pinus strobus*)

Grows up to 150' in height; fast growing NY Native. Thrives in wide range of soil conditions and is shade tolerant. Very long, soft blue-green needles in bundles of five. Widely spaced branches, has a "fluffy" appearance.

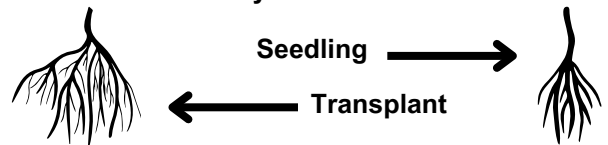
Size: S: 3-0, 6-12"

T: 2-1/3-1, 10-16"



Transplant vs. Seedling Root Systems

Transplants are seedlings that have been "transplanted" from a growing area back into the ground to grow another year or two. Conifer transplants are often larger with thicker stems and more robust root systems compared to a seedling. The size description states the number of years the tree was grown. For example, a 2 - 2 transplant is four (4) years old.

BARE ROOT BROADLEAF SEEDLINGS

MAPLE, RED

(*Acer rubrum*)

Grows 40-60' in height; fast growing. Prefers moist well-drained soils and full to partial sun. Tolerates occasional flooding.

Commonly used as shade trees.

Leaves turn a scarlet red in the fall.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"



MAPLE, SUGAR

(*Abies saccharum*)

Grows 40-100' in height. Prefers moist well-drained soils and is tolerant to full sun or full shade. Not tolerant of heavy wet areas. Leaves are rich green that turn a blend of yellow, orange, and red in the fall.

Is an excellent shade tree.

Size: 2-0, 12-18"



MAPLE, SILVER **NEW!**

(*Acer saccharinum*)

Grows to 50-80' in height; fast growing. Prefers full to partial sun and wet soils. The dark green leaves have silvery appearance on the underside and turn yellow, brown, and red in the fall. Often one of the first trees to produce flowers in early spring.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"

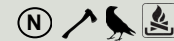


OAK, NORTHERN RED

(*Quercus rubra*)

Grows 60-80' in height. Fast growing, long lived, and NY native. Prefers moist, well-drained soils and full to partial sun. Irregular growing branches. Production of acorns vary on age and weather conditions.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"



OAK, SAWTOOTH

(*Quercus acutissima*)

Grows 50-70' in height; fast growing. Prefers full sun and moderately moist, well-drained soils. Adapts to various soil conditions but is not shade tolerant. Leaves have distinct saw-like edge. Found to be resistant to disease and insect damage.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"



OAK, SWAMP WHITE

(*Quercus bicolor*)

Grows 50-60' in height. Prefers well-drained soils and full sun. Tolerant to road salt and the occasional drought and flooding. Leaves are two-toned with dark green on top and silver on the bottom. An excellent shade tree.

Size: 2-0, 12-18"



SYCAMORE

(*Platanus occidentalis*)

Grows up to 100' in height; fast growing. Prefers moist, well-drained soils and full to partial sun. Tolerant to many conditions. Bark is distinct with brown outside and peeling lighter gray inside. Excellent shade tree. Common for reforestation and streambank stabilization.

Size: 2-0, 12-18"



ASPEN, QUAKING **NEW!**

(*Populus tremuloides*)

Grows to 40'-70' in height; fast growing. Prefers full sun and moist, well-drained soils. The rounded leaves turn a stunning yellow in the fall. Leaves tremble in the wind, thus the name "quaking".

Size: 1-0, 12-18"



BARE ROOT BROADLEAF SEEDLINGS

CHERRY, BLACK

(*Prunus serotina*)

Grows 50-80'; fast growing. Prefers moist, well-drained soils and full to partial sun. Abundant white flowers bloom in the spring and provide dark purple cherries in late summer. The leaves turn red and bronze in the fall.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"



CHERRY, PIN **NEW!**

(*Prunus pensylvanica*)

Grows 35-50' in height; fast growing. Often a shrub like appearance. Prefers full sun and well-drained soils but is tolerant to most soil types. Flowers bloom white in the spring and turns to vibrant reddish yellow in the fall. Red berries produced in the summer.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"

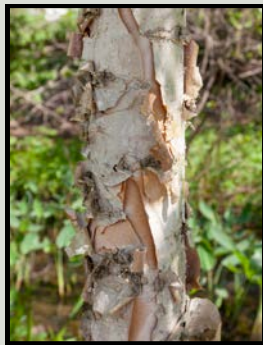


BIRCH, RIVER

(*Betula nigra*)

Grows 40-70' in height. Prefers full sun to partial shade and moist, well-drained or wet soils. Can tolerate heat and poor water drainage. Dark brown and gray bark peels to reveal lighter cinnamon color inner bark.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"

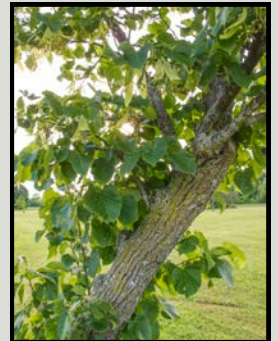


BASSWOOD **NEW!**

(*Tilia americana*)

Grows 60'-100' in height. Prefers moist soils and can tolerate shade. Long dark green heart-shaped leaves that turn yellow in fall. Dense crown of many drooping branches and often has more than one trunk.

Size: 1-0/2-0, 12-18"



SWEETGUM **NEW!**

(*Liquidambar styraciflua*)

Grows 60'-80' in height. Prefers full sun and medium, well-drained soils. Adapts to various soil types but is not shade tolerant. Leaves resemble star shape and are fragrant when crushed. Female flowers develop into hard spiky, dark brown, gum balls that remain on the tree throughout the winter.

Size: 1-0, 12-18"



THORNLESS HONEY-LOCUST **NEW!**

(*Gleditsia trianacanthos*)

Grows 30-70' in height; fast growing. Prefers full sun and moist, well-drained soil. Tolerant of occasional drought and road salt. The fern-like leaves flower in the spring and produce small seed pods (with a honey like substance inside). Thornless variety to prevent injury.

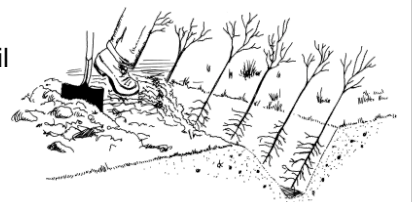
Size: 1-0/2-0, 12-18"



AFTER RECEIVING YOUR TREES

We package your trees in a bag or box, with newspaper, mulch, and root gel to hold moisture on the roots. After you pick up your trees, it is important to keep them in a cool, dark area until planting. We recommend that you plant your trees right away. The sooner they get into the ground, the better chance they have of surviving. As the weather warms up, buds and leaves will emerge on the trees which will draw moisture from the roots. Dry roots will lead to dead trees.

If you cannot plant right away, you can also "heel in" your trees. This method uses an earthen trench to store your trees until they can be planted in the desired location (see the diagram for instructions). Trees can also be temporarily planted in pots. Just be sure that the pot is big enough to hold the tree's roots.



SMALLER TREE & SHRUBS

HAZELNUT, AMERICAN (*Corylus americana*)

Grows 8 - 10' in height; native. This round shrub is tolerant of many soil types but prefers well-drained, loamy soils in full sun to semi-shade. Edible nuts ripen Sept - Oct. Great for shrub borders.

Size: 1-0, 12 - 18"



Highbush Cranberry

CRANBERRY, Highbush (*Viburnum trilobum*) **NEW!**

Grows 8-12' in height, fast growing at up to 3' per year; native. Prefers consistently moist soils but tolerates well-drained. Thrives in partial shade but will grow in full sun. Blooms in May with white/pink flowers. Foliage turns golden olive green and purplish red in autumn. Winter provides bright red fruits for wildlife and jelly making. **Size:** 2-0, 12-18"



ELDERBERRY, BLACK (*Sambucus canadensis*)

Grows 8 - 10' tall; fast growing; native. Tolerant of any fertile, moist soils. White flowers appear in late June followed by ripe, purplish-black fruit in Sept. Edible fruits good for jams, pies, and wines. Careful planting as roots can plug septic/drainage lines. **Size:** 1-0, 12-18"



Spicebush

NINEBARK (*Physocarpus opulifolius*)

Grows 3-10' tall; NY native. Medium to fast growth rate. Prefers moist sandy, loamy, clay soils and will tolerate compacted and droughty soil conditions. Is well suited for soil stabilizing on slopes and attracting pollinators such as honeybees. **Size:** 1-0, 12-18"



SPICEBUSH (*Lindera benzoin*) **NEW!**

Grows 6-12' in height and spread; native. Prefers wet to moist soils and partial sun to shade but will tolerate full sun if soils are not commonly dry. Early spring bloom turns golden yellow in autumn. Red fruits attract wildlife in late summer/early fall months. Has a spicy citrusy aroma when leaves are crushed, or bark peeled from stem. **Size:** 1-0, 12-18"



LILAC (*Syringa vulgaris*)

Grows 12 - 20' tall. Starts as a single stem but becomes a multi-stemmed thicket; easily grown. Flowers range from white to pinkish-purple; prune as needed after flowering. Adaptable to most soils; best in full sun. Excellent for hedges and screens.

Size: 6 - 12" S



BERRY SHRUBS

BLACKBERRY (*Rubus spp.*)

Grows 3-6' tall and are vigorously growing bushes that are incredibly hardy. Produces large, firm, juicy berries over a long period of time (harvest in late summer). Prefers rich and well drained soils but very soil tolerant except for wet situations. Space plants 4 ft. apart with rows 10 ft. apart. Rooted Cutting. **Size:** 1-0, 12-24"

BLUEBERRY HIGHBUSH (*Vaccinium spp.*)

Grows 12 - 15' tall; native. Tolerates most soils except wet ones. Soil must be acidic (sulfur on order form) Flowers are a pinkish/white and appear in May. Fruits are ripe in August to September. Fruits are utilized by both birds and mammals. Edible fruit used for jams, pies, and muffins. Will come as a mix of Jersey and Blue Ray varieties. **Size:** 2-0, 8-16"

RED RASPBERRY (*Rubus spp.*)

Grows 3-5': native. A deciduous shrub blooming in late spring that produces bright berries that ripen in mid-summer. Prefers full sun and well-drained soils but adapts well to a range of soil types. *Do not plant near black raspberries...creates susceptibility to disease & aphids* **Size:** 2-0, 12-18"

SEEDLING PACKAGES



Evergreen Variety Pack

A mixture of evergreens that diversifies the surrounding landscape. Includes a mixture of conifers to enjoy the benefit of each type. Total of 10 trees. Two (2) of each: Balsam Fir transplant, Colorado Blue Spruce transplant, Eastern White Pine seedling, Fraser Fir transplant, and White Spruce transplant.



Edible Fruit Pack **NEW!**

Fresh, edible berries are a hand-picking away. Yield berries for birds and small mammals or for homemade items. Total of ten (10) seedlings: Two (2) of each: Blue Ray Blueberry, Jersey Blueberry, Darrow Blackberry, Latham Red Raspberry, and Jewel Strawberry.



Native Flowering Pack

Will provide a beautiful landscape of white and pink blossoms that the pollinators will also thank you for. Suited for full to part sun and medium, well-drained soils. Total of 10 seedlings. Two (2) of each: White Flowering Dogwood, Elderberry, Serviceberry, Red Osier Dogwood, and Eastern Redbud.



Nut Tree Pack

Now is time to rebuild your forest. Includes trees that will succeed under your dying ash trees and provide acorns for wildlife. Suited for sun to semi-shade and average-moisture soils. Total of 10 seedlings. Two (2) of each: White Oak, Burr Oak, Sawtooth Oak, Pin Oak, and Red Oak.



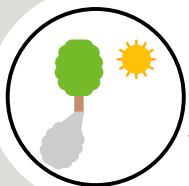
Pond Habitat Pack

Beautify that wet spot. These seedlings will provide year-round interest as well as flowers and seeds for wildlife. Can handle seasonally ponded to seasonally wet low spots. Total of 10 seedlings. Two (2) of each: Red Osier Dogwood, Buttonbush, Sycamore, Willow, and River Birch.



Native NY Wildlife Pack

Create shelter and food sources for a variety of wildlife. This mixed selection of seedlings can especially enhance habitat between forest and grassy areas that are popular for wildlife. Total of 10 seedlings. Two (2) of each: White Pine, Red Osier Dogwood, Black Cherry, American Hazelnut, and Serviceberry.



Shade Tree Pack **NEW!**

A mixture of fast-growing broadleaf trees that provide shade to open areas. These species are tolerant to a variety of soils, perfect for fallow fields or around your home. Attracts an assortment of wildlife. A total of 10 trees. Two (2) of each: Sycamore, Red Maple, Silver Maple, Red Oak, and Hybrid Poplar (cottonless hybrid).

SEMI-DWARF FRUIT TREES

These fruit tree packages are a convenient way to begin a wildlife planting or homestead orchard. Packages are a mix of bare-root semi-dwarf varieties. Nursery selects varieties for you. Trees arrive 4 - 6 ft in height. Fruit trees will be labeled by variety at pick-up.

Apple Homesteader Pack: Extended harvest varieties for multiple use such as Cortland, Grimes Golden, and McIntosh. Total ten (10) trees.

Apple Starter Pack: Hardy, easier-to-grow varieties such as Liberty, Gala, and others. Total five (5) trees.

Heirloom Apple Tree Pack: Time proven favorites such as Northern Spy, Banana, Cox Orange Pippin, Smokehouse, Russets, Old English Varieties, and more! Total Mix of ten (10) apple trees.

SEMI-DWARF FRUIT TREES FOR WILDLIFE

Wildlife fruit trees may be slightly misshapen, have poor form, or missing tags making them inadequate for orchards. These are very suitable for wildlife and will still produce fruit.

The wildlife fruit tree packages will come unlabeled and mixed varieties.

All fruit trees are bare-root, semi-dwarf trees that arrive 4 - 6ft in height.

Wildlife Apple Tree Pack: Mix of five (5)

OR

Ten (10) apple trees



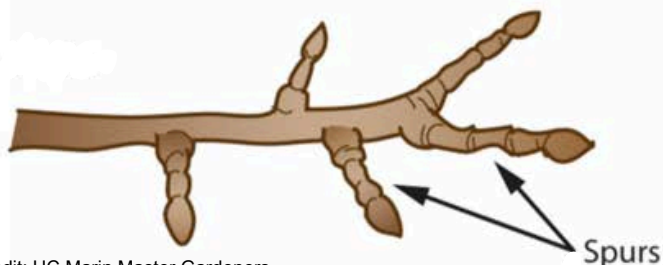

BIENNIAL OR ALTERNATE BEARING IN FRUIT TREES

Biennial or Alternate Bearing is common in fruit trees, specifically apples and pears. It's a phenomenon where the trees will bear fruit in two-year cycles. Many factors can be to blame, but most commonly is energy use.

Buds are formed in the previous growing season - if excess number of buds are present, the trees energy goes into the fruit production of all buds instead of forming buds for next year. Resulting in less abundant production the next season.

To try and correct the problem, start by pruning the buds in spring. To do this, simply use your finger and thumb to rub off 1/2 - 3/4 of the buds per spur. ****Only do this prior to an expected heavy crop year.**

Additional Help

- Add slow releasing fertilizer annually
- Water thoroughly during droughts
- Cover area under tree with mulch to avoid weed/grass growth (nutrient competitors)

FLOWER & COVER CROP SEEDS



Sorghum

WILDLIFE FOOD PLOT MIX: Provides emergency food for turkey, pheasant, and deer in the winter and others during the fall. This annual mix includes Dwarf Sorghum/Red Milo (*Sorghum spp.*), White Proso Millet (*Panicum miliaceum*), Manzanillo Buckwheat (*Fagopyrum esculentum, Manzanillo*), and Black Oil Sunflower (*Helianthus spp.*). Preferably seeded in May-June in areas of full sun with well-drained soils but can be planted in July. This mix can grow approximately 4 feet in height, depending on plant date. This 10 pound bag will cover approximately 8,712 sq.ft (1/5th of an acre).



Radish

COVER CROP: Crop productivity is often linked to the health of your garden's soil. Increase the health of your soil using plants (cover crops). This mixture is an alternate way to fertilize, add nitrogen, break up deep compaction to allow better root development, and to improve soil tilth. Mixture includes four (4) types of seed including rapeseed, radish, oats, and winter pea. Sow the seeds after harvest mid-August thru late-September. The cover crops will grow in the fall and die over winter when temperatures fall below 10°F. Suited for gardens or small agricultural fields, the 5 pound bag covers approximately 1,000 sq. ft. To sustain soil health, plant cover crops every year.



Coneflowers

ANNUAL WILDFLOWER MIX: Restore native habitat in the landscape; a great mixture to supply pollen and nectar for pollinators. Includes 20 flowering annuals such as Clasp Coneflower (*Rudbeckia amplexicaulis*), Indian Blanket (*Gaillardia pulchella*), Rocket Larkspur (*Delphinium ajacis*), and more. Covers 300 sq. ft.



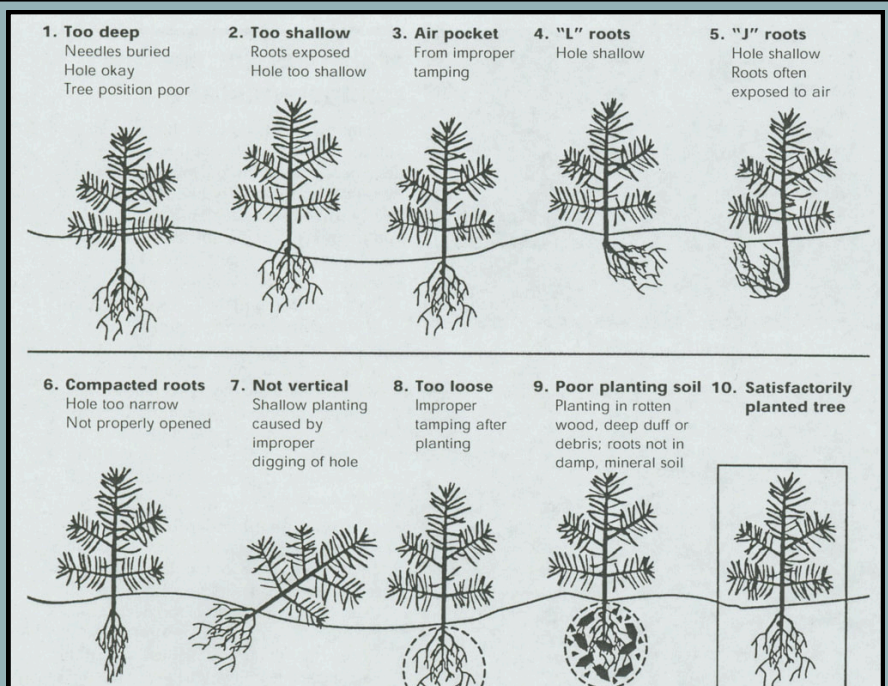
POND EDGE MIX: A diverse mix of 23 upland and wetland grasses and flowering forbs with extensive wildlife and pollinator value. Provides food and cover for songbirds, pheasants, deer and turkey. Can be used to filter nutrients out of runoff to keep your pond cleaner. Good mix for a variety of settings. Includes oxeye sunflower (*Heliopsis helianthoides*), boneset (*Eupatorium perfoliatum*), great blue lobelia (*Lobelia siphilitica*), and more. Covers 300 sq. ft.
