FIFTEENTH DAY GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE Batavia, NY Wednesday, August 9, 2017

The Genesee County Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, August 9, 2017 at 5:30PM at the Old Courthouse, 7 Main Street, Batavia, New York. Legislator Bausch assisted with the audit. Prayer was offered by Legislator Young followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

Chairman Cianfrini opened a comment period to obtain citizen input and to take suggestions on possible public sector shared services opportunities that have <u>not</u> already occurred and are in place. New York State, as part of the Adopted 2017/18 State Budget included another mandate on all local governments to discuss and develop shared services ideas and plans for eventual submittal to the County Legislature in August/September 2017 and then submittal to the New York State Department of State by October 15, 2017. Mr. Don Cunningham asked for a summary of feedback and suggestions provided to the Legislature. Chairman Cianfrini stated that he has not received any comments or suggestions. County Manager Jay Gsell stated that Genesee County will be pursuing a deferral to 2018 which will allow for a more thorough and complete shared services plan that will have a better chance of demonstrating taxpayer savings.

Next, Chairman Cianfrini opened a Public Hearing on Local Law Introductory No. 4, Year 2017, A local law amending Local Law No. 3 of the year 2015 with regard to the imposition of a mortgage recording tax within Genesee County. No one spoke on the matter.

Minutes of the July 19, 2017 Legislature meeting were approved upon motion of Legislator Bausch seconded by Legislator Stein, carried unanimously.

Legislator Deleo expressed his support for the Second Amendment Guarantee Act proposed by Congressman Chris Collins. He stated that he would like to see the Genesee County Legislature consider a supporting resolution. Chairman Cianfrini commented that the legislature could review and consider after going through the proper committees.

The Clerk proceeded with the resolutions:

RESOLUTION NO. 273 CONTRACT RENEWAL – DSS/MH SECURITY SERVICES – APPROVAL OF

Legislator DeJaneiro offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 375 adopted November 12, 2014 did authorize a contract for the provision of security services for the Department of Social Services, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 57 adopted February 11, 2015 did authorize an amendment to the above-noted contract to allow for the provision of security services for the Mental Health Department, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 288 adopted August 10, 2016 did authorize renewal of the abovenoted contract for the period of September 1, 2016 through August 31, 2017, and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Genesee County Request For Bids #2014-15, it is the mutual desire of the Genesee County Commissioner of Social Services, the Director of Mental Health and U.S. Security Associates, Inc. to renew said contract for a second period of one additional year under current rates with the same terms and conditions, and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Human Services has reviewed this request and does concur. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Legislature does hereby authorize and direct the Chairperson to enter into an agreement with U.S. Security Associates, Inc., 625 Delaware

Avenue, Suite 200, Buffalo, NY 14202 for the provision of Security Services at offices occupied by DSS and Mental Health at 5130 East Main Street, Batavia for the period September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2018 at the rate of \$22.60 per man hour.

Budget Impact Statement: The annual DSS cost of the program is \$103,395 with a local share of approximately \$25,910. The annual MH cost of the program is \$90,000 with a local share of approximately \$75,000. The funds for the remainder of 2017 are already included in each Department's current budget, and the funds for 2018 will be included in their requested 2018 Departmental budgets.

Legislator Clattenburg seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

Budget Impact: Estimated annual expenses in the 2017 A 2960 Preschool Supportive Health Services budget are \$270,000 and will be included in the 2018 A 2960 Preschool Supportive Health Services budget

Budget Impact: Estimated annual expenses in the 2017 A 4059 Early Intervention budget are \$40,640 and will be included in the 2018 A 2960 Early Intervention budget. Expenses are offset, up to 100% by revenue generated from Medicaid. New York State is liable for 49% of any non-reimbursed expenditure.

Legislator Stein seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

WHEREAS, The Public Health Director has requested that the County accept this funding which stipulates that this revenue will be used to support local Drinking Water Enhancement activities, and

WHEREAS, The budget line A4010 4800.0000 Program Expense of the 2017 Public Health Budget, will be increased \$4,867 to \$90,789, which will be offset by an increase of \$4,867 to budget line A4010 3401.90 Water Enhancement and

WHEREAS, The Committees on Human Services and Ways & Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Agreement with the New York State Department of Health for the acceptance of the Drinking Water Enhancement Program contract for the period April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018, and to execute any and all other documentation related to this funding

RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to accept the additional \$4,867 from the New York State Department of Health, for Genesee County's Drinking Water Enhancement Program, 2017 Budget A4010 3401.90 Water Enhancement

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2001, the Genesee County Legislature adopted the Genesee County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan by Resolution No. 425, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of Genesee County and its residents to support farm operations and protect valuable agricultural resources for their contribution to the local economy, as the County's No. 1 industry, local source of food and other products, and as an important contributor to the quality of life in rural communities, and

WHEREAS, the Genesee County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan (2001) was developed to protect these valuable agricultural resources, and

WHEREAS, agricultural data, planning initiatives, municipal priorities, and development have changed since 2001, and

WHEREAS, Genesee County was awarded a New York State Agricultural and Farmland Protection grant of \$50,000 for the update of its Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Draft Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan was presented for feedback and comments at public forums, and advisory board meetings, and

WHEREAS, the 2017 Genesee County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan provides a strategic framework for addressing agriculture issues of concern to the County, and

WHEREAS, In accordance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act of 1975, and in accordance with adopted review procedures and the criteria set forth in Part 617, the adoption of this plan has been determined to have no significant effect on the environment, and

WHEREAS, The Draft Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan was reviewed by the Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board which recommended the adoption of the plan at its April 17, 2017 meeting, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Public Service does concur with the recommendation of the Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the 2017 Genesee County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Plan is adopted, and be it further

RESOLVED, That certified copies of this resolution, along with all required documents

pertaining to this plan, be submitted to New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets for review and approval.

Budget Impact: State aid of \$50,000 and County cash match share of \$12,000 as adopted in the 2015, 2016 and 2017 Department of Planning Budget, Account A.8020.4600.0000, Contracted Services.

Legislator Deleo seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 285 PARTICIPATION IN THE U.S. CENSUS BUREAU'S 2020 LOCAL UPDATE OF CENSUS ADDRESSES (LUCA) AND DESIGNATION OF THE GENESEE/FINGER LAKES REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL AS THE THIRD PARTY MEMBER TO CONDUCT THE UPDATE ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY

Legislator Davis offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The U.S. Census Bureau's Local Update of Census Addresses Program (LUCA) is the only opportunity offered to tribal, state, and local governments to review and comment on the U.S. Census Bureau's residential address list that will be used to solicit 2020 Census input within their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council will sign the Title XII Confidentiality Agreement with the Census Bureau, and therefore, will be allowed to access and view the Census Master Address File for the nine counties of the Genesee-Finger Lakes Region (Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, Seneca, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates Counties); and

WHEREAS, the County of Genesee accepts the responsibility of providing and assisting the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council in acquiring resources needed for the compilation of local address data resources countywide including address related databases such as E-911 address files, assessment files, taxation files, and/or other databases that include location information that the. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The County of Genesee authorizes the Chair of the Legislature to complete and sign all appropriate documentation to designate the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council to be the third party member to conduct the Local Update of Census Addresses on behalf of the County.

Budget Impact: None

Legislator Bausch seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 286 GENESEE, LIVINGSTON AND WYOMING COUNTIES INTERMUNICIPAL CONTRACT - APPROVAL OF

Legislator DeJaneiro offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Genesee, Livingston and Wyoming Counties (GLOW) Region Solid Waste Management Program Intermunicipal Cooperation Contract is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2017, and

WHEREAS, The GLOW Region Solid Waste Management Committee does recommend the continuation of the contract, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Public Service did review said recommendation and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Legislature does hereby approve the Intermunicipal Cooperation Contract through December 31, 2019, and Be it further

RESOLVED, That the Chairperson of the Genesee County Legislature be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Intermunicipal Cooperation Contract on behalf of the County of Genesee.

Budget Impact Statement: \$25,805 is the projected annual contribution for 2018. In 2012 this contribution was reduced by 4.4%. From 1997 until 2011 the contribution was \$27,000. Each year the actual County Contribution is approved by the County Legislature through the annual Budget Process.

Legislator Torrey seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 287 CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE- GLOW REGION SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE EVENT: REGIONAL PRIMARY CARE NETWORK HEALTH AND WELLNESS BACK TO SCHOOL FAIR- APPROVAL OF

Legislator DeJaneiro offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Recycling Administrator has been invited to participate in the Regional Primary Care Network (RPCN) Health and Wellness Back to School Fair in Mt. Morris for the purpose of providing education on waste reduction, recycling, reuse and composting and has requested approval to participate in this event on , and

WHEREAS, The Public Service Committee does concur with these recommendations. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to issue a Certificate of Insurance for participation by GLOW Region Solid Waste Management Staff to participate in the RPCN Health and Wellness Back to School Fair on August 11, 2017.

Budget Impact: There is no cost for the this event.

RESOLUTION NO. 288 ACCEPTANCE OF GRANT FUNDS - BUDGET AMENDMENT/SHERIFF – POLICE TRAFFIC SERVICES PROGRAM – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Sheriff requested authorization to accept grant funding from the NYS Governor's Traffic Safety Committee, in the amount of \$26,016, to participate in the statewide Police Traffic Services Program, for the time period of October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Public Service and Ways and Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2017 budget by increasing Sheriff's account A3110.1020.0700 (Overtime – STEP Grant) in the amount of \$26,016, to be offset by an increase in revenue account A3110.4511 (Federal Aid Traffic Safety) in a like amount.

Budget Impact Statement: Increase in Sheriff's appropriation of \$26,016, from GTSC grant funding from the Police Traffic Services Program, offset by an increase in revenue in a like amount.

RESOLUTION NO. 289 AWARD OF BID/ BUDGET AMENDMENT – SHERIFF'S OFFICE / CEDAR STREET TOWER MAINTENANCE -ALLSTATE TOWER, INC - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Bausch offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Genesee County was informed that the top 200 feet of the public safety radio tower located at 153 Cedar St, Batavia, NY 14020, lacked proper galvanization due to normal wear, and

WHEREAS, Genesee County received a NYS Statewide Interoperable Communications Grant (Round 5) which included funds for radio tower maintenance, and

WHEREAS, Genesee County issued BID 2017-13 on June 12, 2017, and received one response from Allstate Towers, Inc. for \$19,850.00, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee County Sheriff, Director of Emergency Communications, Communications Coordinator, and Purchasing Director recommend Allstate Tower, Inc. be awarded the bid at a cost not to exceed \$19,850.00 for tower painting and inspection, and

WHEREAS, The Committees on Public Service and Ways & Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now therefore be it

WHEREAS, said 87-97 bed jail had its physical origin in the early 1900's and the NYSCoC has recently conducted another compliance survey in early 2017 which raised concerns with regard to both the physical integrity of the facility and the adherence to supervision and programming for said inmates,

WHEREAS, said NYSCoC survey requires Genesee County to conduct a 2017/18 jail space needs analysis in the hope of maintaining said 10-bed variance, Now therefore Be it

RESOLVED, that the Public Service Committee of the Genesee County Legislature that is hereby authorizing the Chairperson of the County Legislature to execute a contract for professional services to SMRT Architects, Engineers and Planners, Latham, New York in an amount not to exceed \$33,950 which funds are available in the 2017 County budget asset acquisition allocation equal to \$110,000.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Genesee County Legislature:

That Resolution No. 297 of the Genesee County Legislature adopted November 26, 1980, as amended by Resolution No. 16 of 1981, adopted January 14, 1981, as amended by Resolution No. 184, adopted June 22, 1994 as amended by Resolution No. 227, adopted July 31, 1995, as amended by Resolution No. 218 adopted July 28,1997, as amended by Resolution No. 327 adopted August 11, 1999, as amended by Resolution 333 adopted September 12, 2001, as amended by Resolution 211 adopted June 25, 2003 as amended by Resolution 298 adopted September 10, 2003, and as amended by Resolution No. 226 adopted July 12, 2005 and as amended by Resolution No. 309 adopted August 8, 2007, as amended by Resolution No. 270 adopted August 12, 2009, as amended by Resolution No. 311 adopted September 28, 2011, as amended by Resolution No. 337 adopted September 11, 2013 **as amended by Resolution No. 353 adopted October 14, 2015** be amended in its several parts as follows:

Section 1: The first sentence of section two of Resolution No. 297 of the year 1980, enacted November 26, 1980, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2: Imposition of sales tax.

On and after March 1, 1981, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid a tax of three percent (3%) upon, and for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending **November 30, 2017**, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an additional tax of one percent (1%) upon:

Section 2: Subdivision (f) of section three of Resolution No. 297 of the year 1980, enacted November 26, 1980, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

(f) With respect to the additional tax of one percent (1%) imposed for the period commencing September 1, 1994 and ending **November 30, 2020**, the provisions of subdivision (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) of this section apply, except that for the purposes of this subdivision, all references in said subdivision (a), (b), (c) and (d) to an effective date shall be read as referring to September 1, 1994, all references in said subdivision (a) to the date four months prior to the effective date shall be read as referring to May 1, 1994, and the reference in subdivision (b) to the date immediately preceding the effective date shall be read as referring to August 31, 1994. Nothing herein shall be deemed to exempt from tax at the rate in effect prior to September 1, 1994 any transaction which may not be subject to the additional tax imposed effective on that date.

Section 3: Section four of Resolution No. 297 of the year 1980, as enacted November 26, 1980, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4: Imposition of compensating use tax.

(a) Except to the extent that property or services have already been or will be subject to the sales tax under this enactment, there is hereby imposed on every person a use tax for the use within this taxing jurisdiction on and after September 1, 1994 except as otherwise exempted under this enactment, (A) of any tangible personal property purchased at retail, (B) of any tangible personal property (other than computer software used by the author or other creator) manufactured, processed or assembled by the user, (i) if items of the same kind of tangible

personal property are offered for sale by him in the regular course of business or (ii) if items are used as such or incorporated into a structure, building or real property, by a contractor, subcontract or repairman in erecting structures or buildings, or building on, or otherwise adding to, altering, improving, maintaining, servicing or repairing real property, property or land, as the terms real property, property or land are defined in the real property law, if items of the same kind are not offered for sale as such by such contractor, subcontractor or repairman or other user in the regular course of business, (C) of any of the services described in paragraphs (1), (7) and (8) of subdivision (c) of section two, (D) of any tangible personal property, however acquired, where not acquired for purposes of resale, upon which any of the services described under paragraphs (2), (3) and (7) of subdivision (c) of section two have been performed, (E) of any telephone answering service described in subdivision (b) of section two and (F) of any computer software written or otherwise created by the user if the user offers software of a similar kind for sale as such or as a component part of other property in the regular course of business.

(b) For purposes of clause (A) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent (4%) and on and after December 1, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent (3%), of the consideration given or contracted to be given for such property, or for the use of such property, including any charges for shipping or delivery as described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one, but excluding any credit for tangible personal property accepted in part payment and intended for resale.

(c) For purposes of subclause (i) of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2015, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent (4%), and on and after December 1, 2015, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent (3%), of the price at which items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by the user, and the mere storage, keeping, retention or withdrawal from storage of tangible personal property by the person who manufactured, processed or assembled such property shall not be deemed as taxable use by him.

(d) For purposes of subclause (ii) of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending **November 30, 2020**, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent (4%), and on and after **December 1, 2020**, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent (3%), of the consideration given or contracted to be given for tangible personal property manufactured, processed, or assembled into the tangible personal property the use of which is subject to tax, including any charges for shipping or delivery as described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one.

(e) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, for purposes of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, there shall be no tax on any portion of such price which represents the value added by the user to tangible personal property which he fabricates and installs to the specifications of an addition or capital improvements to real property, property or land, as the terms real property, property or land are defined in the real property tax law, over and above the prevailing normal purchase price prior to such fabrication of such tangible personal property which a manufacturer, producer or assembler would charge an unrelated contractor who similarly fabricated and installed such tangible personal property to the specifications of an addition or capital improvement to such real property or land.

(f) For purposes of clauses (C), (D) and (E) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending **November 30, 2020**, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent (4%), and on and after **December 1, 2020**, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent (3%), of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the service, including the consideration for

any tangible personal property transferred in conjunction with the performance of the service and also including any charges for shipping and delivery of the property so transferred and of the tangible personal property upon which the service was performed as such charges are described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one.

(g) For purposes of clause (F) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending **November 30, 2020**, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent (4%), and on and after **December 1, 2020**, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent (3%), of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the tangible personal property which constitutes the blank medium, such as disks or tapes, used in conjunction with the software, or for the use of such property, and the mere storage, keeping, retention or withdrawal from storage of computer software described in such clause (f) by its author or other creator shall not be deemed a taxable use by such person.

Section 4: Subdivision (k) of section six of Resolution No. 297 of the year 1980, enacted in November 26, 1980, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

(k) Exemption of certain energy sources and related services from additional one percent rate of tax. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of this resolution, receipts from the retail sale or use of fuel oil and coal used for residential purposes; the receipts from the retail sale or use of wood used for residential heating purposes ; and the receipts from every sale, other than for resale, or use of propane (except when sold in containers of less than one hundred pounds), natural gas, electricity, steam and gas, electric and steam services used for residential purposes shall be exempt from the additional one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes imposed by sections 2 and 4, respectively, of this resolution for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending **November 30, 2020**.

Section 5: Paragraph (B) of subdivision one of section eleven of Resolution No. 297 of the year 1980, as enacted November 26, 1980, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

(B) With respect to the additional tax of one percent imposed for the period beginning September 1, 1994, and ending **November 30, 2020**, in respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in this county prior to September 1, 1994.

Section 6: Subdivision (h) of section fourteen of Resolution No. 297 of the year 1980, as enacted November 26, 1980, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

Outer Forty Drive, Chesterfield, Missouri, 63017 to provide Excess Insurance for the Genesee County Self-Insurance Plan effective August 1, 2017 through July 31, 2018 for a total premium of \$197,143

Budget Impact: \$7,237 decrease over the 2016-2017 policy, primarily from the sale of the County Nursing Home. Funds for this insurance have been provided in the Self-Insurance budget and apportioned to the participants.

Legislator Deleo seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

APPOINTMENT-GENESEE COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY D/B/A GENESEE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CENTER ("GCEDC")-APPROVAL OF

WHEREAS, The Genesee County Industrial Development Agency (GCIDA) was created by an Act of the Legislature of the State of New York on May 8, 1970 by Chapter 565 of the laws of 1970 and set forth in section 895-e of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, The GCIDA was created by Resolution No. 177 of the Genesee County Legislature on September 23, 1970 to consist of 5 members "who shall serve at the pleasure of the Genesee County Legislature", and

WHEREAS, The membership of the GCIDA was increased by Resolution No. 225 of the Genesee County Legislature on September 19, 1979 from 5 to 7 members with "said term of office expiring at the pleasure of the Genesee County Legislature.", and

WHEREAS, Todd Bender submitted an appointment application to the Genesee County Legislature requesting appointment to the seven member board of the Genesee County Industrial Development Agency, d/b/a the Genesee County Economic Development Center ("GCEDC"), and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Ways and Means does recommend Mr. Todd Bender be appointed at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Legislature does hereby appoint Mr. Todd Bender of Batavia, New York to the Genesee County Industrial Development Agency d/b/a the Genesee County Economic Development Center effective August 9, 2017 to June 30, 2023.

Budget Impact Statement: none.

Chairman Cianfrini clarified a statement he made at the Ways & Means Committee meeting regarding his concern with the appointment to the GCEDC Board. He stated that his reference to a concerted effort to remove Maryann Waiter was made by staff, specifically Steve Hyde, not GCEDC Board members. He said that fellow board members valued the expertise and perspective she brought to the board therefore they appointed her to the GCLC board.

Legislator Davis seconded the resolution which was adopted by 298 votes, Legislator Cianfrini (28) No.

RESOLUTION NO. 316 APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSIONER OF SOCIAL SERVICES-APPROVAL OF

Legislator Stein offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Eileen Kirkpatrick, who has served as DSS Commissioner since July 31, 2004, is retiring from her position effective October 16, 2017, and

WHEREAS, The Interview Committee and the Ways & Means Committee do recommend that David Rumsey, who has held the position of Commissioner of Social Services in Wyoming County, be appointed to the position of Commissioner of Social Services. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby appoint David Rumsey as Commissioner of Social Services effective October 16, 2017 through October 16, 2022 at Grade 121, at an annual rate of \$85,844 in the Genesee County Management Salary Schedule.

The project requires securing bonds to assist with the project costs. The motion was seconded by Legislator Stein, carried unanimously

RESOLUTION NO. 319 RESOLUTION COUNTY OF THE GENESEE LEGISLATURE, AS THE ELECTED LEGISLATIVE BODY OF GENESEE COUNTY, NEW YORK, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 147(F) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE "CODE"). CODE OF 1986. AS AMENDED (THE APPROVING ISSUANCE THE BY THE **GENESEE COUNTY FUNDING CORPORATION OF UP TO \$2,500,000** TAXABLE AND/OR TAX-EXEMPT REVENUE BONDS (MERCY FLIGHT, INC. PROJECT), SERIES 2017

Legislator Bausch offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Genesee County Legislature (the "Legislature"), as the elected legislative body of Genesee County, New York (the "County") has been advised by the GENESEE COUNTY FUNDING CORPORATION (the "Issuer") that, in order to assist in the financing of a certain Project (as defined below) for the benefit of MERCY FLIGHT, INC. (the "Company"), a New York not-for-profit corporation and an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), the Issuer proposes to issue, contingent upon the adoption of this Resolution, its Taxable and/or Tax-Exempt Revenue Bonds (Mercy Flight, Inc. Project), Series 2017, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$2,500,000 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the project (the "Project") shall consist of: (1) the acquisition of approximately two (2) acres of land located off of Route 98 and Call Parkway (next to Gateway II) on Oak Orchard Road, Town of Batavia, Genesee County, New York, being more particularly identified as tax map number 4-1-26.112 (the "Land"); (2) the construction and equipping on the Land of an approximately 11,500 square-foot one-story ambulance headquarters to include storage and maintenance space for ambulances, administrative offices and training facilities (the "Improvements"); (3) the acquisition and installation in and around the Improvements of certain items of machinery, equipment and other tangible personal property (the "Equipment"; and, together with the Land and the Improvements, the "Facility"); and (4) the paying of all or a portion of the costs incidental to the issuance of the Bonds, including issuance costs of the Bonds, capitalized interest and any reserve funds as may be necessary to secure the Bonds (the costs associated with items (1) through (4) above being hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Project Costs"); and

WHEREAS, on May 16, 2017, the Town of Batavia Planning Board, in accordance with Article 8 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations promulgated thereto at 6 N.Y.C.R.R. Part 617 (collectively referred to as "SEQRA") issued a negative declaration (the "Negative Declaration") in accordance with to SEQRA with respect to the Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 147(c) of the Code, interest on the Bonds will not be excluded from gross income for Federal income tax purposes unless the issuance of the Bonds is approved by the County Legislature after a public hearing to consider both the issuance of the Bonds and the nature and location of the facilities financed therewith has been conducted following reasonable public notice; and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2017, the Issuer held such a public hearing upon proper notice in compliance with the Code; and

WHEREAS, to aid the Legislature in its deliberations, the Issuer has made available to the members of the Legislature prior to this meeting (a) the Company's application to the Issuer for financial assistance; (b) the Full Environmental Assessment Form and related documents submitted by the Company to the Issuer; (c) the notice of public hearing published by the Issuer on June 30, 2017, in *The Daily News*, together with the affidavit of publication of such newspaper, (d) the minutes of such public hearing held on July 17, 2017; and (e) the Issuer's Official Intent Resolution, adopted on June 21, 2017, with respect to the proposed issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature, after due consideration of the foregoing, as the "applicable elected representative" of Genesee County, New York, within the meaning of Section 147(f)(2)(E) of the Code, desires to approve the issuance of the Bonds, provided the principal, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds shall be special obligations of the Issuer and shall never be a debt of the State of New York (the "State") or any political subdivision thereof including, without limitation, Genesee County, New York and neither the State nor any political subdivision thereof including, without limitation, Genesee County, New York shall be liable thereon. Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Genesee County Legislature as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> For the purpose of satisfying the approval requirement of Section 147(f) of the Code and on the recommendation of the Genesee County Ways and Means Committee, the Legislature hereby gives its approval of the issuance by the Issuer of the Bonds; *provided* that, the Bonds, and the premium (if any) and interest thereon, shall be special obligations of the Issuer and shall never be a debt of the State of New York or any political subdivision thereof including, without limitation, Genesee County, New York and neither the State of New York, shall be liable thereon.

Legislator Stein seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

The meeting adjourned at 6:08 PM upon motion of Legislator Stein, seconded by Legislator Bausch, carried unanimously.
